There's a name for this: It's called a Doom Loop. A Doom Loop is where a bunch of bad things cycle back on themselves making the situation worse and worse. Child's Way school is an example of the Doom Loop happening here, **in our neighborhoods**, right now.

Here's what it is: We don't have a **fire district**, so the school can't get **insurance**. Without **insurance** you can't have a **school**. So, those **jobs** at the school are **lost** and the teachers move away. No teachers and no school, so **families with kids** also **move away** or don't move here in the first place, and the community becomes a **drought** of renewal. Outsiders see this 'drought' and choose to move elsewhere. **Lack of services perpetuates the Doom Loop** and the cycle spreads and repeats itself throughout a community, often slowly but it still happens.

Do we want this? I think not!!
